

## Open Space Typologies for DAP Glossary

Allotments	Allotments provide areas for people to grow their own produce and plants.
Amenity Green Space	Minimum 0.15 hectares in size, open to free and spontaneous use by the public, but neither laid out nor managed for a specific function such as a park, public playing field or recreation ground; nor managed as a natural or semi-natural habitat.
Park and Recreation Grounds	Comprises the general open space surrounding play areas and sports facilities used for general recreation as well as outdoor sports space including publicly accessible sports pitches and other non-pitch provision including publicly accessible tennis courts and bowling greens.
Play Space (Children)	Areas of play that cater for the needs of children up to and around 12 years. Children's play space can include formal equipment such as slides and swings and/or areas of landscaping and natural building materials which create areas to explore.
Play Space (Youth)	Areas for informal recreation for, broadly, the 13 to 16/17 age group, and which might include facilities like skateboard parks, basketball courts and 'free access' Multi Use Games Areas (MUGAs).
Natural Green Space	Covers a variety of partly or wholly accessible spaces including meadows, woodland and copses all of which share a trait of having natural characteristics and wildlife value, but which are also open to public use and enjoyment.
